Hello Fisher House Supporters - I'm Michelle Power, Health Systems Specialist and Executive Assistant to Eric Leal, VA Puget Sound Health Care System's Assistant Director. Spring means new beginnings and exciting changes are in the forecast for Fisher House management over the next few months. I've been temporarily assigned as your "acting" Fisher House Manager while we search for someone permanent to lead this wonderful and important program. As a member of the Executive Office staff, I've been involved with our Fisher House since its conception. Mr. Leal is the senior executive in charge of this program and together our goal is to promote the Fisher House program to the hospital and the community.
